Annual Conference is almost here! . . . *“What’s Annual Conference?”* you ask.

Annual Conference is a yearly gathering of all the clergy and the lay representatives of all local churches in a “conference” for the purpose of sharing information about what has been happening around the conference over the past year and to conduct conference business. Creighton UMC will be represented by Pastor Jean, Lay Representative Fran Leon, and Alternate Lay Representative Michael Van.

Creighton United Methodist Church is a part of the Desert Southwest Conference which, in turn, is one of many Conferences that make up The United Methodist Church. The DSW Conference covers all of Arizona, southern Nevada, and eastern California and includes over 130 churches. The DSWC is divided into four districts: North, South, Central West, and Central East of which Creighton is a part. The Desert Southwest 27th Annual Conference will begin on Wednesday, June 23 and will conclude on Sunday, June 26. This year’s Annual Conference will again be held at the Renaissance Hotel in Glendale.

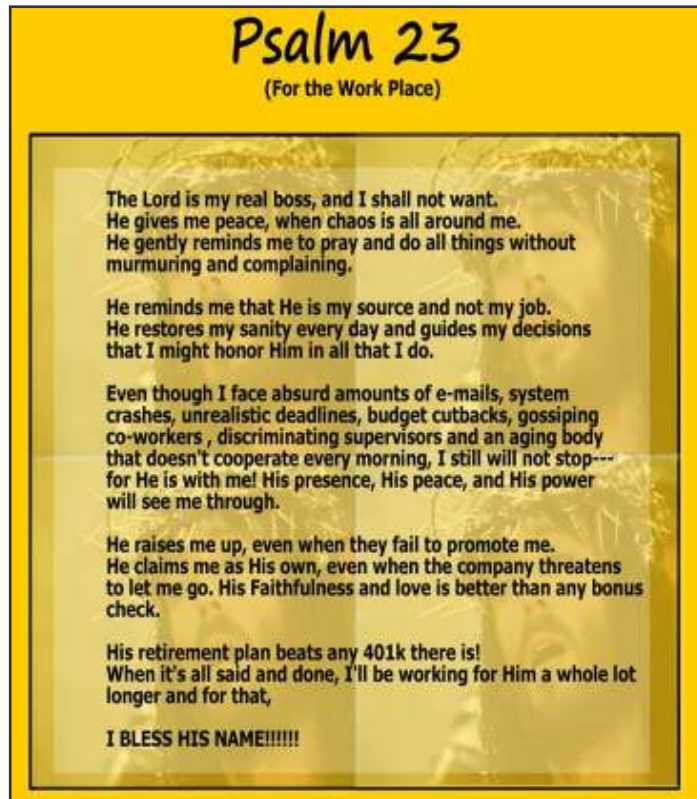
The theme for this year’s Annual Conference is “Extravagant Hospitality: God’s Abundant Grace.” Besides the various committee reports that will be given, Saturday has been designated as a “Day of Learning.” Dr. Gil Rendle, who has served as senior pastor of two urban congregations and is today the Senior Consultant with The Institute for Clergy and Congregational Excellence of The Texas Methodist Foundation in Austin, Texas, will lead the day long workshop. *“In a time when the world is changing quickly, the church seems to be out of step, often accused of being irrelevant and powerless. Dr. Rendle will help us examine the mission field, challenge us to become relevant, claim our power, become fruitful, and show us how to build the conversation that will sustain us for the journey of discipleship in the name of Christ Jesus.”* (quoted from 2011 Conference registration material)

Participants of Annual Conference will also be voting on nineteen resolutions covering such topics as AIDS, Mental Health, Conservation and Renewable Energy, Disability Awareness, and removal of discriminatory language about homosexuality from *The Book of Discipline* among other issues. Eight pastors are retiring; two are being commissioned, and two are being ordained. From the opening worship and memorial service to Friday night’s Celebration of Ministry Dinner to Saturday night’s ordination service and Sunday morning’s worship service and fixing of appointments, Annual Conference is a time honored tradition begun by John Wesley, the founder of Methodism, as a time not only to conduct the business of the Conference but to celebrate the ministry of the past year and to look forward to the opportunities of even more ministry in the year to come.

As clergy and laity prepare to gather for this year’s Annual Conference, please keep the participants and the entire Conference in your prayers ever mindful that ***Christ calls to all of us to go and make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world!***

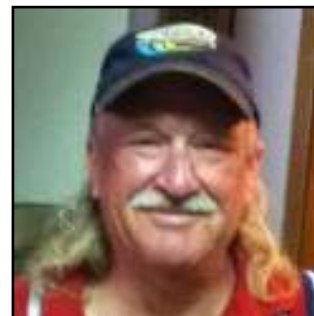

## *2011 Confirmation Mission Project*

Over the past few weeks, many of you have donated a variety of articles for the 2011 Confirmation Mission Project which involves preparing **Birthing Assembly Kits** that will be sent to UMCOR headquarters in Salt Lake City. The UMCOR birthing kits will then be sent all over the world where needed to provide the essential items to promote safe, clean deliveries and to encourage good aftercare. Each kit is valued at \$8.

*The 2011 Confirmands have challenged themselves to prepare 50 birthing kits*, so they took inventory of what they had already collected to see what is still needed. They found they are still in need of the following items:

- 7 small bars of soap (1 to 2 oz. size)
- Clean string (at least 50 feet is needed)
- 50 single edge razor blades
- 50 (individual) square yards of 4 mil thick clear plastic sheeting
- 40 new receiving blankets (30" x 30" or 32" x 32") No thermal or fleece blankets please.

**PLEASE NOTE:**

1. All items must be new.
2. Do not wash any of the items as they will be considered used.
3. All emergency kits are carefully planned to make them usable in the greatest number of situations. Since strict rules often govern product entry into international countries, it is important that kits contain only the requested items—nothing more.

If you would like to help the Confirmands with their Mission Project, please place donations in the specified box located in the narthex by **Sunday, June 19**. If you would care to make a financial contribution, cash in a marked envelope or checks made out to the church and designated for "Confirmation Mission Project" can be placed in the Sunday offering plate or dropped off at the office during office hours.

Our Confirmands are ready for the challenge they have set for themselves! How about it? By helping these young disciples meet their challenge, not only will you make a difference for them, but your contribution could be the one item that will mean the **ultimate** difference for a mother and her child!
